Spreading rays of warm sunshine with her beautiful smile and sunny disposition, the Scotts Valley Senior Center, acknowledges just how lucky we are to have Sandy Payton heading up the Wheels on Meals Program at our site. This SoCal native was born in Long Beach, CA. Shortly thereafter, her family moved to the San Fernando Valley. During the interview, she laughed and said she, her sister and their friends were the original "Valley Girls" long before the term was ever coined!



Sandy spent many happy years working at Cal State Northridge in the Student Aid Business Office. She received great joy from helping students find financial aid opportunities to help fulfill their dreams. During that time, her family grew; she has three daughters and one son.

In 1992, circumstances required her to move to Colorado. Although initially it was hard to find work, Sandy eventually found work in Denver although it did mean an 84 mile drive each way, everyday, from her rural mountain home to her office in the city. Her work once more was focused on helping people, this time as a case manager for the Colorado Aids Project for 16 years.

Her sister is close by (Kay has been in the area for over 40 years), and her family has now grown to include six grandchildren and her great-grandchild, Liam.

With the help of her volunteers and her sunny disposition, Sandy runs a tight ship on the Meals on Wheels Program at the center. Under her watch it has flourished and garnered an excellent reputation. Sandy also runs one of the kitchens during the annual two-day Holiday Craft Faire and is the Bunko co-chair with Irene Bustichi. In her spare time she loves to line-dance, is a voracious reader, and is an avid supporter of the visual and performing arts and....she volunteers at Valley Churches Mission.



Read This to check your Credit Card Status...

Whether you want to know how many credit cards to carry or when Junior should get his own card, you've got questions. Lucky for you, we've got answers!

How many credit cards should I have?

Ah, this would be the \$64,000 question. Some well-known financial gurus would tell you the answer is zero. Meanwhile, other card experts say they have up to 20 active accounts open at any given time.

However, Adam Levin, founder of our partner site Credit.com, suggests a more middle-of-the-road approach. He says you should consider having two cards — a rewards credit card for everyday use and a low-interest card to be used for emergencies.

Why not have just one good all-purpose card? Mainly because you'll want to earn rewards from your purchases, but airline, gas and cash-back cards tend to have higher interest rates. That's fine as long as you're paying off your balance each month.

But when the water heater says "No more" and your savings account says "Yeah, right," you'll want a low-interest credit card waiting in the wings. You don't want to carry a balance on a high-interest rewards card.

Should I be carrying a balance?

Heck, no!

Unless you're self-financing a purchase or dealing with an emergency situation, paying credit card interest is just plain dumb.

Now, some people believe you need to carry a balance for your credit score to benefit, but that's not really the case.



You can read this article to learn more about why no balance is needed to boost your score.

What exactly is my credit score and how is it calculated?

Speaking of credit scores, some people are a little hazy on what that is and how it's calculated.

While there are several different companies creating credit scores, the one most likely to influence your access to credit and interest rates is your FICO score.

Your main FICO score runs from 300 to 850, and companies use it to decide how well you manage your credit and how likely you are to pay them back if they give you money. The higher the score, the more trustworthy you appear to creditors.

The score is created and weighted with the following information:

- Payment history – 35 percent.
- Amounts owed – 30 percent.
- Length of credit history – 15 percent.
- New credit — 10 percent.
- Types of credit used – 10 percent.

FICO doesn't say what constitutes a good or bad credit score. However, typically, if your score is below 600, you're probably viewed as risky business.

A score above 800 will generally get you the best interest rates and terms.
